Remember the four 'R's to safeguarding

- **Recognise** (go with your gut feelings, if it doesn't feel right- talk to your CWO or the BJA safeguarding Team. Child Protection - British Judo and Introduction to Safeguarding - British Judo
- **Respond** to the needs of the person at risk or something they have told you - talk to your CWO or the BJA safeguarding Team. Child Protection - British Judo and Introduction to Safeguarding - British Judo
- **Report**- if someone is in immediate danger or risk, call emergency services on 999. Report all concerns to your CWO or the BJA safeguarding Team. Child Protection - British Judo and Introduction to Safeguarding - British Judo. From February 2024, this can be done via MyVoice
- **Record**- pass to the safeguarding team and we will save in our case management system.
