Introduction	<p>This is the first pilot event for No-Gi Judo in Wales. There will be a one hour coaching session on No-Gi Judo highlighting the rules and regulations this will be followed by a competition.</p> <p>This trail event of No-Gi Judo is being run and facilitated by Alan Jones IJF 8th Dan for Welsh Judo Association & British Judo Association.</p> <p>Further details regarding the British Judo No-Gi can be found on the British Judo website link.</p>

Event Level & Tournament Licence	<p>This event will operate under a Pilot Event tournament licence and will be operate differently to the British Judo Tournament Handbook and British Judo Contest Rules.</p>

Participation	<p>Competitors must hold current Welsh Judo, BJA or affiliate membership. All competitors must bring their valid judo membership card and book to registration.</p>
Categories: Male & Female	<p>Players must be minimum of 14 years of age or older.</p> <p>Contest Duration: 4 minutes</p> <p>Players will be put into pools of 3, 4, 5 or 6 based upon their gender, age, grade, weight & competition experience with the aim to create meaningful contests and provide fighters with as much contest time as possible.</p>
Competition Format and Uniform Rules	<p>A mandatory one hour coaching session will be run before contests start to highlight the rules and allow players to become accustomed before the competition. Players must attend the session to able to take part in the pilot event.</p> <p>This event aims to introduce fighters to a new way of practicing judo without the Judogi. Players must wear a t-shirt/rash guard, shorts & their judo belt.</p> <p>T-Shirts/Rash guards: Both genders must wear a shirt of elastic material (skintight) long enough to cover the torso all the way to the waistband of the shorts, coloured blue or white,</p> <p>Shorts : Board shorts coloured black, white, black and white, and/or the colour of the rank (belt) to which the athlete holds, without pockets, buttons, exposed drawstrings, zippers or any form of plastic or metal that could present a risk to the opponent, long enough to cover at least halfway down the thigh, and no longer than the knee. Also permitted are compression shorts made of elastic material (skin tight) coloured black, white, black and white, and/or the colour of the rank (belt) to which the athlete holds. The shorts must not have pockets, must not have buttons, zippers or any kind of plastic or metal that could present a risk to the opponent, and must be long enough to cover halfway down the thigh and no longer</p>

than the knee.

Accessories:

The Judo belt will be worn with first name called in White and second name in blue.

Footwear or wrestling boots are not permitted.

Knee or elbow pads are permitted in line with British Judo competition rules, they must not contain any metallic or hard plastics.

Event Pilot Rules

Both competitors will bow at the beginning and end of the match. The match will start with Hajime and stop with Matte. Hansoku-make will be called for disqualification.

No-Gi Judo rules emphasise the importance of traditional and modern judo awarding points for shoulder throws, sacrifice throws, sweeps, hooks, leg grabs and take downs with good control, hold downs, armlocks & strangles. It allows a limited time for each match, of four minutes. During that time, judges award points for certain techniques and control positions:

- 3 points for throws, takedowns and sweeps with opponent landing on back.
- 1 point for throws, takedowns and sweeps with opponent landing on bum or front.
- 2 points for holds of 10 seconds or more
- 1 point to turn your opponent 180 degree in a controlled position
- 1 point for control position of opponent on all fours or flat on belly.
- 6 points for submission strangle, choke or armlock

Points system which accumulates, the first player to gain 6 points clear wins the match.

No golden score; the last person that scored is the winner.

Judges award points only if the players can keep the position with full control.

Negative Points or Penalties:

There are some instances when a competitor may receive negative points - each penalty gives your opponent 2 points. The most important things you need to note to avoid penalties are the following:

- Stalling tactics.
- Stepping out of the area will give you a penalty.
- No ankle, knee or leg Locks are permitted
- No neck cranks or head locks
- No supplex backwards throw
- There are also other conditions that may get you disqualified, such as restricted attacks. The list of illegal moves is pretty extensive and will be covered in the coaching session.

In the event that nobody has completed a submission in the allotted time frame, or hasn't scored 6 points clear of opponent, the point system comes into play to identify the winner.

Advantage Point

If no player completes a submission or scores any points during a match, advantage point come into play as a last resort. Advantage point is decided by referee, he will give the player who they deem to of put the most attacks in the advantage and the other player has 30 seconds before the end of the contest to score a point or the initial player with gain the point and the win. That said, it is important to remember that advantage points only apply when nobody scores. It doesn't matter if the opponent has countless advantages. If the player scores, even just one point, they will win.

Registration & Weigh-In	Players will weigh-in prior to the coaching and rules session. Players must weigh-in wearing t-shirt and shorts.
